Esafety - Mr O's Online Safety Corner

Research by the Internet Watch Foundation on images and video captures of live-streamed child sex abuse found 98% of victims were aged 13 or younger. Popular sites such as Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and Snapchat all have live streaming features available - But have you heard of Musical.ly, Live.ly, Twitch.tv or Hang w/ ? Probably not, but these lesser known apps and sites are where the majority of live-stream grooming takes place.

What can you do? Parental controls, strong passwords are a good place to start, but nothing will beat interacting with your children and hearing about the apps and sites they are using.

If you're worried that a child or young person is at risk or is being abused you can contact the children's social care team at their local council. You can choose not to give your details. You can report it online to the Child Exploitation and Online Protection command (CEOP) - there's a link on the school website. Alternatively, you can call the NSPCC 24-hour helpline on 0808 800 5000 for expert advice and support.

If a child is at immediate risk call 999, or call the police on 101 if you think a crime has been committed.

Sun Cream and Coats – a plea please!

Please can we ask that sun cream is applied to children before school in order for them to be protected during the school day. On particularly hot days, our sun policy allows, where parents have given signed consent, for children to apply their own suncream that has been provided in a named bottle. Please ensure your child gives their class teacher these bottles.

Eco Schools and School Council

We are currently working towards renewal of our green flag. Many thanks to everyone who supported our Walk to School Week – we really appreciate it.

Reports

School reports will be sent out on Friday 6th July. Please can I ask you to read them and celebrate your child's achievements as well as their targets for the future, and come in and discuss anything that you wish following receiving the report.
