## **Events in school**

Thank you to all the parents, grandparents and friends who supported Year 5's sponsored penalty shoot-out event. We are pleased to advise that, to date, we have raised £450 which will be sent to the chosen charity. If you still have sponsor money, please can you send it in before the end of term.

## **School shoes collection**

As we did last year, Year 5 are arranging as part of their Archbishop of York young leaders award, to collect any worn school shoes (where children will not need them for the new school year!) on the last day of term. If you are happy to donate your children's school shoes to charity, please let them come to school in trainers or alternative shoes suitable for school next Wednesday and bring their old

shoes and pumps with them to put in boxes provided.

## **Curriculum evenings**

## **Attendance**

The overall attendance for the school year is 96.4%. The target for school is currently set

at 96%. Thank you to the children who have attended so well. There are 30 children in school who have successfully achieved 100% attendance and will receive their certificate in school next week.

A child could be at risk of investigation by the LA if their attendance is below 90%. Children with attendance below 95% are also monitored closely. Please, as a polite reminder, remember that family holidays can no longer be authorised by school due to a change in guidance from the DfE. Families choosing to take holidays in term time may be liable to a fine from the local authority.

### **Children's books**

Some children like to bring their school workbooks home at the end of the school year. This year we are proposing to send the children's books home at the end of the year. If your child wishes to bring their books home, please send a carrier bag in with them on Monday.

### **Social Media and Whatsapp**

Please can I ask parents to respect the social media policy you have signed in school. We understand that you want to celebrate your children's achievements, however some parents do not want their children on social media or pictures to be shared, which is why we have the policy in place. We also understand that communication through whatsapp can be helpful for reminders in school, but we would please ask that this remains professional as on occasions, whether intended or not, some parents may be offended by some posts. Please can we also ask that photos of other children are not shared through Whatsapp group messaging either.

It really does support your child's learning in school and we do appreciate it. Children, although not bringing school reading books home for summer, will still have access to a number of online resources and will be receiving their log in reminders on Monday as part of the Meet the teacher paperwork issued on the evening. Parents will also receive the children's summer project to research as part

of this and we would appreciate any help you can give your child with this.
