In Maths, we will be continuing to develop a range of methods for addition and subtraction. We will be using the inverse to check answers and will learn to identify factor pairs. We will begin to develop strategies to multiply 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers.

We will continue revisiting all of the multiplication facts up to 12×12 .



This half term and next half term we will be starting our new unit 'Which wild plants and animals thrive in your locality?' We will be identifying and naming living things in our school grounds, classifying them into groups and recognising that environments can

change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.



History
