English

To begin this term, we will be exploring Beatrice
Alemagnas book 'The 5 Misfits' and using
it to inspire our writing. Through the use
of the book, we will be clarifying lots of
new language and responding to the text
by composing our own discussion.

Mathematics

In Maths, we will be exploring and

developing an understanding of numbers to 10,000. The children will be developing their fluency, reasoning and solving problems in ordering and comparing numbers to 10,000 and rounding to 10,100 and

We will also be revisiting the 10, 5, 2, 4 8 and 3 times tables before moving onto the Year 4 facts: 6, 9, 12, 11, 7.

P.E.

Year 4 have swimming on Wednesdays. All the children need to have a swimming kit with a costume/trunks, a towel and a swimming cap.

P.E. will be on Thursdays. Children need to wear their P.E. kit to school consisting of a school P.E. t-shirt, black jogging bottoms or shorts and pumps/trainers.

Reading Books
