


Year 1 Newsletter Autumn 2

English

In English, we are going to be looking at the 'The Tiger Who came to Tea' by Judith Kerr. We will be having the tiger visit Year 1 for afternoon tea, so we will be preparing for his visit! Over the half-term we will continue recapping our phonics knowledge from Reception and practicing a range of new phonics.

Maths

Our Maths focus is making comparisons according to attributes such as length (or height or breadth), volume/capacity or weight/mass.

We will also begin to look at estimating on a number line.

<u>P.E.</u>

Year 1 will have P.E. on a Tuesday and Wednesday. They can wear their PE kit to school on these days: black/grey joggers, red t-shirt and black trainers. Children should wear their normal school jumper or fleece for outdoor sessions.





<u>R.E.</u>

In R.E. we will be learning about what it means to belong in a faith community. We will look at what it means to belong, and the different ways religions celebrate special events, such as marriage.

Science

This half-term, we will look at the seasonal changes between Autumn and Winter. This will include learning about how daylight changes, and the signs to tell us it is Autumn or Winter.

Reading Books

Reading as regularly as possible to an adult can really help your child's progress. We would like to see your child read a minimum of FIVE times a week, which will be checked every Monday. Once they have read, an adult should log on Boom Reader.



Homework is set every Friday and should be returned by <u>Wednesday</u>. Please encourage your child to complete their homework to a high standard.

Geography

Year 1 will be learning about the changes of seasons in our local environment. This will include identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom by asking questions about the changing environment. We will also observe the outdoor environment in our school grounds during the Autumn/Winter months to identify changes.
