


English

In English, we will be writing a biography based on one of the children in 'Empathy - A Child Like You'. We will also write an alternative story ending and a persuasive advert using 'The Great Kapok Tree' by Lynne Cherry. Excitingly, the class will perform a poem about animals to the school. We will be revising our grammar knowledge, improving our self-editing and practising a range of spelling patterns.



Maths

In Maths, we will be mastering percentages (equivalent fractions and decimals), learning about geometry (properties of shapes and position and direction) and measurement (converting units and perimeter). We will also continue to develop our arithmetic skills with all four operations.

P.E.

Year 5 will have P.E. on a Monday and Friday afternoon. Your child's kit should consist of black shorts, black pumps and a red t-shirt. For outdoor sessions long, black jogging bottoms, trainers and a sweatshirt can be worn.




R.E.

This half-term, we will be learning about Earth and space. This will include learning about the movement of Earth and other planets in relation to the sun, the orbit of the moon, the shape of the Earth, sun and moon and how day and night are created.



Reading Books
