# **Mathematics**

In Maths, we will be exploring numbers with one and two decimal places including partitioning, finding 0.1 more or less than a given number, comparing and ordering, rounding and representing on a number line. We will continue revisiting all of the times table facts to 12 x 12.





#### Science

In science, the children will be learning about 'The Water Cycle'. Then, we will begin our new topic 'What happens to the food that we eat?' This will involve

describing the simple functions of the human digestive system and of teeth.

#### History and Geograhpy

This half-term we will be completing our Romans topic and then beginning our Geography topic 'What would we find if we explored Eastern Europe?' where we will be learning about key features on a world map or globe, comparing time zones and exploring the human and physical features of Eastern Europe.
