English

To begin, Harriet Tubman will inspire our writing.

We will then be exploring Emily

Gravett's 'The Rabbit Problem'. Through
the use of the book, we will be clarifying
lots of new language and responding to
the text by composing our own diary
entries and advertisements.

Mathematics

In Maths, we will be exploring and developing an understanding of numbers to 10,000. The children will developing their fluency, reasoning and solving problems in ordering and comparing numbers to 10,000 and rounding to 10,100 and

We will also be revisiting the 10, 5, 2, 4 8 and 3 times tables before moving onto the Year 4 facts: 6, 9, 12, 11, 7.

This half term we will be exploring the topic 'What do Hindus believe God is like?"




Homework is set every Friday and should be returned by Wednesday. Please encourage your child to complete their homework to a high standard every week.
